How to Apply

- Stockport School is very popular and is always over-subscribed.
- We have a Pupil Admission Number (PAN) of 240 students for September 2018

Stockport School Admissions Criteria

- A. Looked after children and previously looked after children
- B. Children considered to have highly exceptional medical / social reasons
- C. Children who live in the catchment area of the school and will have a sibling at the school at the time of admission
- **D.** Children who live in the catchment area of the school
- **E.** Children of staff who have been employed at the school for a minimum of two years or are offering a shortage subject/area
- F. Children who will have a sibling at the school at the time of admission and reside outside the catchment area
- G. Any other applicants, in order of straight line distance measured between home and the school
- H. Applications received after the closing date ordered by the criteria detailed at A-G above
- Follow the Local Authority guidance closely to ensure you secure a place.
- ✓ You **MUST** apply in time, by **October 31st 2017**. (You will hear the outcome on 1st March 2018).

- ✓ You have up to 6 choices Rank in order of Preference!

- ✓ Parent Partnership will also be able to help you, should you need them.

What if I don't get a place???

- ✓ Follow the Local Authority appeals process. We have <u>no say</u> in who gets in.
- ✓ Stockport School will be allocated up to <u>240</u> students, as this is the agreed Admission Number for September 2018.
- ✓ We are a successful and popular school, and as such we are usually oversubscribed.
- ✓ You have the right of appeal, via Stockport Local Authority.
- ✓ Parents' do win appeals in addition to the 240, for genuine reasons every year. So you should seriously consider this, if unsuccessful.
