6. Your work will be reviewed by an assessor who has appropriate competence, has had no previous involvement in the assessment of that candidate and has no personal interest in the review.
7. We will carry out the review, make any necessary changes to marks and inform you of the outcome, all before the exam board's deadline.
8. We will instruct the reviewing assessor to ensure that your mark is consistent with the standard set by us.
9. We will inform you in writing of the outcome of the review of our marking.

The moderation process carried out by the awarding bodies may result in a mark change, either upwards or downwards, even after an internal review. The internal review process is in place to ensure consistency of our marking. The mark submitted to the exam board is subject to change and should therefore be considered provisional.
