
Working Together to Make Homework Successful

What does Research say about Homework?

- The average secondary school homework policy has the positive impact of more than 5 months of education!
- There are greater benefits for disadvantaged pupils.



- The average secondary school homework policy has the positive impact of approximately 1.2 GCSE grades per subject.
- Best homework
 outcomes are from
 tasks strongly linked to
 classroom learning.



- Great teachers set great homework!
- Lots of Mode A
 Homework: Practice,
 revision, pre-study,
 questions, exercises.
- Some Mode B
 Homework: Research,
 open-ended projects,
 creative product making, choices.






2024/2025 Impact

Attitude to Learning (AtLs)	Average GCSE Grade Achieved	
Outstanding – Always completes Compulsory Homework and regularly engages in Extra Credit	7-	
Good – Always completes Compulsory Homework	5=	
Concern – Is inconsistent with Compulsory Homework completion	4-	47% or resitting GCSE English or maths or both of them
Significant Concern – Is highly inconsistent with Compulsory Homework completion	3+	67% or resitting GCSE English or maths or both of them





Why Homework is **important**!

Pupil engagement strongly links with pupil progress and GCSE outcomes.

Pupil engagement strongly links with post 16 education possibilities.

Pupil engagement strongly links with future earnings.

The difference between averaging a grade 6 in every subject compared to averaging a grade 3 is approximately £300,000!

How Homework works at Stockport School

Expectations for Compulsory Homework and Extra Credit

- Homework will be set according to each year group's timetable and will be set on <u>Firefly</u>.
- Homework will be split into Compulsory
 Homework (the key knowledge and skills to make strong progress) and Extra Credit.
- The expected completion time for Compulsory
 Homework has been reduced to enable
 students to focus on the quality of their
 homework.
- The Extra Credit work provides extra
 opportunities for student to do independent
 learning, revision and earn more rewards.

Rewards

- Every completed homework will be rewarded with Proud points.
- Weekly email home for students who get rewarded 4 or more times in a week for homework.
- Half termly bonus Proud Points for those who get zero homework consequence points.
- Additional rewards will be given out in rewards assemblies.

Consequences and Sanctions

- Home notification for every <u>missing</u> or <u>incomplete</u> homework.
- <u>No</u> consequence points.
- **No** detentions.

How Parents/Carers can Support at Home

- 1. Establish a consistent homework routine.
- 2. Create a calm space with essentials ready.
- 3. Guide, don't rescue let them think first.
- 4. Check completion and effort, not just accuracy.
- 5. Praise effort and organisation.






Top 5 Homework Habits of Successful Students
